The Present Perfect Simple Tense

How to form the present perfect

- Learn about USING the present perfect here
- For a list of all the present perfect exercises

To make the positive present perfect tense, use:

- 'have' / 'has' + the past participle
- Make the past participle by adding 'ed' to regular verbs (for example, 'play' becomes 'played')
- There are a few verbs that change their spelling when you add 'ed' (for example, 'study' becomes 'studied')
- We also have some completely irregular verbs

Positive	Positive Short Form
l have played	l've played
you have worked	you've worked
he has written	he's written
she has walked	she's walked
it has rained	it's rained
we have travelled	we've travelled
they have studied	they've studied

The negative is really simple too. Just put 'not' after 'have' or 'has':

Negative	Negative Short Form
I have not eaten breakfast today	l haven't eaten
you have not been to Asia	you haven't been
he has not seen the new film	he hasn't seen
she has not played tennis	she hasn't played
it has not snowed this winter	it hasn't snowed
we have not slept all night	we haven't slept
they have not tried the food	they haven't tried

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To make a question, put 'have' or 'has' in front of the subject:

'Yes / No' Questions
have I missed the bus?
have you visited London?
has he worked as a waiter before?
has she met John?
has it been cold this week?
have we arrived too early?
have they studied English grammar before?

As you can imagine, for 'wh' questions, we just put the question word before 'have' or 'has':

'Wh' Questions
where have I left my umbrella?
what have you done today?
why has he gone already?
where has she been in the UK?
why has it rained so much this summer?
what have we done?
where have they learned English before?

How modern life affects our physical and mental health

Modern day living is a combination of evolving technology and social media. Communication channels are changing every part of our lives so rapidly that it can be tough to adjust. Are technology and media affecting our physical and mental health?

Technology has improved the lives of many people, with almost half of adults in the United States unable to imagine life without their smartphone.

The American Psychological Association's Stress in America Survey 2017 **shows** that 99 percent of adults own an electronic device, around 86 percent own a computer, 74 percent own a smartphone, and 55 percent own a tablet.

The survey also **reports** that between 2005 and 2015, the percentage of adults using social media skyrocketed from 7 percent to 65 percent.

Rates of technology and social media use **are** therefore climbing. The two most popular social network sites **boast** a combined monthly user base of 2 billion people.

Recent research found that teenagers aged 13 to 17 years old have shifted their preferred social media platforms.

They also found that although 91 percent of teens regularly use text messaging, 40 percent also use the most popular messaging apps.

Social media and text messaging have become an integral part of how individuals interact with their social groups. In fact, for many teenagers and young adults, text messaging and social media communication is now more frequent than in-person interactions.
